

Year 13 Results Day Tuesday 10th August 2021. Information Sheet for Parents and Students

The information below sets out how Year 13 students can collect their results on Tuesday 10th August. We are also planning on ensuring post- results support is available on the 11th and 12th of August for those students who need it. You should also monitor the [Awarding Grades](#) page of the school website where we will alert you if there are any changes, as a result of national or local restrictions, to these arrangements.

Our intention is to ensure that you are able to collect your results safely, in the context of increasing cases in the community and receive any support that you need. You will see throughout our plans that we are working to avoid congestion on the school site.

When can students collect their results?

- **Results are not allowed to be issued this year before 8.30 am and UCAS will be communicating with university applicants from 8.30 am.**
- **8.30 am-9.00 am** all students who have **conditional offers** should come in from 8.30 am. UCAS Track is a system you will know about if you have applied to university. Track updates at 8.30 am on the 10th and you should be able to see whether you have got into your Firm or Insurance choice. Being in school will mean you can access support and guidance quickly.
- **9.00 am -11.00 am** the rest of Year 13 (those with unconditional offers or not going to university in 2021) arrive to collect results
- Both Hall 1 and Hall 2 will be used for the giving out of results to avoid congestion. There will be staff present to tell you where to go for your results. Please enter via the main school car park.

GCSE Maths and English re-sits. These results are available on **12th August**. Students should arrive either at 8.30 am or after 11.00 am due to the large number of Year 11 students who will be coming in in a staggered fashion for their results.

What happens if a student cannot come into school to collect their results?

If it is at all possible then we would encourage students to come into school. Staff will be here to support you and to answer any questions you may have about your results and what this means for your chosen destination in September. However, if you are not able to attend school then please be reassured that all results will be sent to student's school email accounts on the afternoon of Tuesday 10th August.

Will there be any Covid-19 control measures in place?

We are conscious that the virus will still be in circulation and so we will be putting in place control measures in line with the [schools' covid-19 operational guidance that applies from 19th July 2021](#). These are set out below:

- Students should not attend school if you: have [covid-19 symptoms](#); have tested positive for Covid-19; or [should be self-isolating](#)
- Students should sanitise their hands on entry to school and regularly whilst in school
- All students and staff are asked to exercise good respiratory hygiene, "catch –it, bin-it, kill-it"
- Students are requested to wear a face-mask whilst in the school building
- Students are encouraged to take and report a Lateral Flow Test on the evening of the 9th of August
- Any rooms used in the school will be well-ventilated and will have been cleaned

Can Parents and Carers enter the school site whilst results are being collected

In order to avoid congestion, this will not be possible. However, we are aware that sometimes students need their parents with them on Results Days and we will facilitate meetings with a member of staff later in the day for students with their parents, (after 12 midday) if there is a concern that needs talking through. There will also be appointments available on the 11th of August. These appointments will be made with the students in the morning or can be booked via telephone (0115 9387000) during the day.

Will students be able to access independent careers advice?

The careers service plan to be in school on the 10th and 11th August and will be working in well ventilated and cleaned spaces

How can Parents and Carers contact us on the 10th and 11th August?

The phones in the school reception will be monitored between 8.30 am and 3.30 pm on the 10th and between 9.00 am and 3.00 pm on the 11th. You can phone 0115 9387000 if you do need to talk to someone.

Will students be able to appeal their results?

Yes, they will. However, all students should be aware that there are three possible outcomes of their appeal. Following an appeal, grades could be lowered, stay the same, or increase.
