#### Nuffield Research Placements are now OPEN

<u>Nuffield Research Placements</u> give sixth form students hands-on experience of a professional research environment through a 4-6 week placement in their summer holidays. By working with professional researchers, students gain insight into a wide variety of STEM careers, they are able to make more informed choices about what to do after school or college. By providing a placement, your organisation can give someone a life-changing opportunity that will help transform them into a future scientist. Projects must have broadly scientific or technical content, but they don't have to be based in a laboratory. They might be office-based or include a lot of fieldwork, or they might focus on engineering, data analysis, psychology, economics, forensics, law or computer science. We make sure no-one is excluded on a financial basis by covering students' travel costs, and some students may also be eligible for a weekly bursary in addition to travel expenses

#### You should meet the following criteria if you want to apply:

- Be over 16 years old and in Year 12
- Have at least 5 GCSEs (or equivalent) at Level 6 or above, including maths, a science subject and English (or another humanities subject).
- Be studying one or more A-level in science, technology, geography, psychology, maths.
- Be able to spend four weeks of your summer holiday working on a research project.

#### You must also meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Your family has a combined household income of below £30,000 a year.
- You are entitled to free schools meals, either now or at any time in the last six years.
- You live, or have lived, in local authority care.

# Ukraine jet downed by Iranian missile, western officials believe

The passenger jet that crashed shortly after takeoff from Tehran on Wednesday was accidentally shot down by an Iranian anti-aicraft missile, western security officials believe.

Intelligence sources told the Guardian their assessments suggest two surface-to-air missiles had targeted the Ukraine International Airlines Flight 752 that went down in Iran on Wednesday morning, killing all 176 people on board.

The Canadian prime minister, Justin Trudeau, speaking at a hastily convened press conference yesterday, said his government "will not rest" until it got justice.

Of the 176 people on board, 79 were Ukrainian, 61 were Canadian and 11 were Ukrainian (including nine crew members), along with 10 Swedes, seven Afghans, three Britons and three German nationals.

"We have intelligence, including from our allies and own intelligence that the plane was shot down by Iranian surface to-air missiles," Trudeau said. "Canadians want answers. That

means transparency, accountability, and justice."
Western agencies are understood to have picked up signals of the missile launches followed by the traces of an explosion. A British source said: "The assessment is that it looks like it

"The assessment is that it looks like it is a tragic accident."
The passenger aircraft crashed in farmland on the outskirts of Tehran a few hours after Iran had launched more than a dozen missiles at US forces stationed in Iraq, during a period when Revolutionary Guards commanders say they were expecting an imminent US response and were on high alert.

The revelation that the plane might have been shot down will prompt a reassessment of the consequences of Donald Trump's decision to assassinate the Iranian general Qassem Suleimani last week, an escalation of hostilities that brought the region to the brink of all-out conflict.

Iranian officials yesterday rejected the western intelligence assessments. "Scientifically, it is impossible that a missile hit the Ukrainian plane, and such rumours are illogical," All Abedzadeh, the head of Iran's of Civil Aviation Organisation, told a state-run media outlet. The revelation that the plane might

## Top royals scramble to forge plan for Meghan and Harry

The Queen, Prince of Wales and Duke of Cambridge have instructed their senior aides to work with the UK and Canadian governments to help carve out new roles for the Duke and Duchess of Sussex within "days not weeks". The three most senior royals were engaged in crisis talks yesterday after Prince Harry and Megham's bombshell announcement that they are to "step back" from being senior royals and split their time between Britain and North America. Palace officials hope a resolution, with a fully worked out and agreed plan, can be announced in days to help achieve the couple's ambitions for "progressive" new roles. Royal aides have been told to work with the Sussexes and government representatives "at pace", according to sources. There is said to be a willingness to make
